An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.

Anticipation Guide - Reading Rockets

An anticipation guide is a strategy to activate your students' prior knowledge prior to reading a text. Choose a short reading (no more than three pages) that you want to cover in detail with

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your students. Determine the main concepts that you want your students to obtain from the article.

Either display the cover or read the opening paragraph and ask the children to answer each question with either yes, no or maybe. The emphasis is not on right answers or to make correct predictions.
