This is one of the reasons why the use of pesticides in forestry activities on National Forests must be based on analysis of effectiveness, specificity, environmental impact, economic efficiency and human exposure.

Pesticide Health & Safety

Pesticides are commonly used in agriculture to protect crops from insects, diseases, and weeds. Because chemical pesticides are toxic to the target pest, they can also be harmful to human health and/or the environment. While most farmworkers do not handle pesticides, they are still exposed to pesticide residue at work.
